TrueNorth Wellness Services provides Autism programs to children, adolescents, and adults with Autism Spectrum Disorder or Social Pragmatic Communication Disorder off-site (home, school and community-based), as well as on-site at our Hanover and Red Lion Amazing Kids Club facilities. We offer one-on-one interventions as well as group treatment plans designed by Master's Level clinicians. Using research-based treatment modalities from the Applied Behavior Analysis and Relationship therapies, clinicians assess and place individuals into services that best meet their needs. Treatment plans are developed by highly trained clinicians and focus on individual and group goals with the involvement of the child, family, school, and support systems.

The Amazing Kids Club Program

The Amazing Kids Club is a year-round, on-site therapeutic program for children and adolescents from 2 to 21 years of age with Autism Spectrum Disorder or Social Pragmatic Communication Disorder. The program focuses on developing communication, socialization and play skills in a less intense environment than one-on-one strategies and is designed as either a stand-alone program or a supplement to other forms of treatment.

The program is a combination of behavioral and relationship therapy strategies and our Master's Level clinicians design treatment plans to meet the developmental needs of each individual. Family involvement and service coordination are key components of our programs. We offer Before School and After School sessions, as well as an eleven-week specialized therapeutic summer day program.
