# **Building Fund Update**

Congratulations St. David's on reaching another letter on our Building With Faith banner. This represents less than \$75,000 remaining to pay off the loan from the Mission Investment Fund. That means fourteen letters done and just three to go.

Due to your extreme generosity and diligence with this project, St. David's was able to make a large principal reduction payment in May.

The results are as follows:

- Knock off 39 payments or 3 and 1/3 years off the loan schedule
- Save approximately \$21,000 in interest payments
- Current payoff date is July 2026 but with this payment its is reduced to May 2023

Original amount of loan from MIF: \$165,346.93 -- Interest rate – 3.875 %

Currently we have \$ 98,005.22 remaining on the loan. That is a significant payment in a very short amount of time. We started making loan payments July 1, 2016.

With your continued attention to this debt and your generous contributions we can continue to make great strides toward paying offf this debt. Thank you for your generosity and may God continue to guide us through this project.
